**New River Train**

September 21-24, 2015

**Day 1: (D)** Today we travel to Huntington, WV and check into the *Hampton Inn*, our home for the next 3 nights. This evening we visit the **Heritage Farm Museum & Village**. As you tour from building to building the decades pass and you have witnessed 50 years of rapid change in American life as Americans moved from an agrarian to an industrialized society. Following our tour, you'll enjoy a catered dinner before we return to our hotel.

**Day 2: (B, D)** After breakfast we'll tour the **Blenko Glass Factory**, one of the last producers of hand blown glass in America. Next, we travel south into West Virginia's coalfields. Learn about the **Matewan Massacre** which occurred during a labor dispute in 1920 when local miners, who had joined the newly formed United Mine Workers Union, were being fired and evicted from their company-owned homes. In the midst of this hostile atmosphere, mine owners hired mercenary guards to quell the rebellion which ultimately led to the shootings. To show their support, fellow coal miners from across West Virginia tied red bandanas around their necks and marched to Matewan. It was from this march and those bandanas that the phrase "Redneck" was first coined.

This afternoon learn about the bitter feud which occurred in this region from 1878 to 1891 between two local families, the **Hatfields and the McCoys**. Our local guide will share the history of the events as we visit some of the feud sites. Tonight, enjoy the **Hatfield and McCoy Show** before dining on a **Stolen Pig Dinner**, served with all the trimmings.

**Day 3: (B, L, D)** All aboard! Today we board the New River Gorge Train for our journey from Huntington to White Sulphur Springs. During our excursion, you will pass waterfalls and whitewater, see Hawks Nest and the New River Bridge plus remote river and rail towns whose histories were tied to coal. The ride ends at *The Greenbrier Resort's Rail Station* where we transfer to **The Greenbrier** for a marvelous **buffet lunch**. Following lunch we will **tour the Bunker**, a secret facility built during the Cold War to house the members of Congress in case the U.S. came under foreign attack. Workers on the project were sworn to secrecy, and not even

the townspeople knew of its existence! Later we visit **Tamarack, “The Craft Center of West Virginia”** with time for shopping and a nice dinner (vouchers included).

**Day 4: (B)** Today we bid farewell to West Virginia and travel home.
